Major Taylor: Fastest Cyclist in the World

- Overhead music and spoken word poetry will be playing in the entrance of the exhibit.
- Lighting can be low in some areas.
- Move a bike pedal to see how the chains move the wheels, and ring the bike bell.
- Listen to stories of community cyclists through video and audio clips.
- Test your skill at changing a tire. You might need help from an adult.
- Sit down with your family and play a tabletop card game recreating a bicycle race.
- Open a locker door to listen to Major Taylor's opponents and critics and hear the language and attitudes expressed toward him on and off the track.
- Flip through a reproduction of Taylor's scrapbook to see how he tracked his racing career.
- Test your racing speed against Taylor on a stationary bike.











- Take a photo with a life-sized image of Major Taylor.
- Take a break and read a book in the reading area.
- Explore a world map and follow Taylor's travels through postcards.
- Hear an actor, portraying Taylor, read some of his postcards and letters to his family.
- See Taylor's original 1903 track bike and trophies.
- Children can ride a pre-made bike on the bike track. There are three different sizes. You might need to wait in line to ride a bike. Helmets are available.
